



Curana Interoperability APIs Release Policy

Initial release July 01, 2021

ONC's Cures Act Final Rule supports a patient's control of their health care and their medical record through smartphones and modern software apps. The rule supports secure patient access to their electronic medical record data. Patients will be able to use software applications they authorize to receive data from their medical records.

In support of the Cures Act, Curana Health has created Interoperability APIs to enable our members to gain electronic access to their data via third-party software applications.

Curana Interoperability APIs enable members of client Medicare Care Advantage payers and their authorized representative(s), to consent to have their data shared with third-party applications. It also allows third-party application owners to connect to provider and pharmacy directories, further referred to as “public non-member specific data.”

Curana Health is committed to Cures act and patient access final rule. Clinical data for members that will be shared via Curana Interoperability APIs are data maintained within the Curana Health systems. Any new clinical information of members received and maintained by Curana Health systems in the future will be shared through the APIs either by updating existing application functionalities or by adding new features.

The timing of new releases and scope of the release will be determined by Curana Health as changes are made to our systems and data held within them. Every time a change is made to the APIs, release notes will be published with new and/or updated functionalities.
